Information for Laryngectomy Patients

FREE PRESCRIPTIONS

All laryngectomees, whatever their age are entitled to free NHS prescriptions. If you are under 60 you will need an exemption form.

Applications should be made on form FP92A which is available from GP surgeries and NHS hospitals.

There are companies who distribute the laryngectomy supplies direct to your home.

HOSPITAL FARES

You may be able to get help with your parking or travel costs:

- If you receive certain benefits
- Have a blue disabled badge
- Some areas have schemes that help with fares and travel
- Visitors may also be able to claim if it's a close relative or partner
- Parking in Northern Ireland is free if you are having radio or chemo therapy. In Scotland and Wales most hospitals are free. Some hospitals in England have reduced parking costs.

Always check with the hospital and find out their parking policy.

BENEFITS

You may be entitled to benefits when you have been affected by Cancer. It is advisable to speak to a benefits advisor to see what you may be

entitled to. Macmillan Cancer Support has welfare rights advisers that can help you access benefits you may be entitled to.

Laryngectomees may qualify for benefits that cover their care and or mobility needs, these benefits are not means tested:

PIP – Personal Independence Payment

This is a benefit for people aged 16-65. PIP replaces an older benefit called Disability Living Allowance – DLA. To apply for PIP you must have had difficulties for a minimum of three months. PIP is based on how your condition affects you, not the condition you have. To apply for this benefit you or a carer must call 0800 917 2222. You will need your national insurance number, bank details and GP details. The operator will ask a series of questions. If you are unable to speak on the phone you may ask someone else to do it for you but you must be present when they call.

ATTENDANCE ALLOWANCE

This benefit is for people aged 65 or over. For an application form call DWP's Attendance Allowance helpline on 0345 605 6055 or textphone 0345 604 5312. You can also download the form from the website www.gov.uk

MACMILLAN GRANTS

These are small, mostly one off payments to help people with costs caused by or related to their cancer.

You can apply for a Macmillan Grant if you have cancer, or are still affected by your illness and if:

Your savings amount is no more than £6000 if you are single or £8000 as a couple or family. Individual circumstances are taken into account.

To apply for a Macmillan grant you need to apply through a health or social care professional, or Macmillan nurse. They will help you to fill in the form. For further details contact Macmillan on 0808 808 00 00.

EMERGENCY IDENTIFICATION

These items give information about a laryngectomy's medical condition. They advise that breathing is through an opening in the neck and that, in cases of need, mouth to neck resuscitation should be applied.

LIFE – Laryngectomy Information for First Aid and Emergency Treatment DVD

Emergency Card – This is a credit card size card which is red & blue explaining the emergency procedure for laryngectomees.

Emergency Car Stickers – Self-adhesive orange stickers for display on car wind-screens. Gives

instructions that mouth-to-neck resuscitation should be given, in case of an emergency

Emergency Wristbands – Red rubber wristbands with the words: Resuscitate Via Neck Stoma Neck Breather!

Emergency SMS – If you cannot make voice calls, you can now contact the 999 emergency services by SMS text from your mobile phone. You must register to use this service. For more information visit:

Rail Card – you may qualify for a disabled persons rail card. You and your carer would travel for 1/3 off the normal fare. A yearly card costs £20 or a 3 year card is £54.
